

Mr. Andrew Sheng is a former central banker and financial regulator in Asia and a commentator on global finance. He is Pro-Chancellor of Bristol University and Distinguished Fellow, Asia Global Institute, University of Hong Kong, as well as Chairman, George Town Institute of Open and Advanced Studies, Wawasan Open University, Malaysia.

Mr. Sheng is a member of International Advisory Council of National Financial Regulatory Administration (NFRA), China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC), China Investment Corporation (CIC), China and he is one of the Chief Executive's Council of Advisers, The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region.

Mr. Sheng sits in the Advisory Board of Bank Indonesia Institute. He is a member to Commission on Global Economic Transformation, chaired by Nobel Laureates Stiglitz and Spence. He sits in the Malaysia International Islamic Financial Centre (MIFC) Leadership Council and as a Distinguished Fellow, Institute for Capital Market Research, Malaysia.



He served as Chairman of the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong from 1998 to 2005, having previously been a central banker with the Hong Kong Monetary Authority and Bank Negara Malaysia. He also worked with the World Bank from 1989 to 1993. From 2003 to 2005, he chaired the Technical Committee of the International Organisation of Securities Commissions (IOSCO). He was a Board Member of Khazanah Nasional Berhad, the sovereign wealth fund of Malaysia. He was an International Advisory Board Member of Thailand Development Research Institute.

He has a First Class Honours in Economics from Bristol University, and Honorary Doctorates from University of Bristol and University of Malaya. He is an Adjunct

He is a Professor by Practice at School of Business and Administration, Wawasan Open University, Malaysia. He also the distinguished professor at The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shenzhen campus.

Mr. Sheng is author of "From Asian to Global Financial Crisis: An Asian Regulator's View of Unfettered Finance in the 1990s and 2000s" (2009), and co-editor (with Ng Chow Soon) of the book, "Bringing Shadow Banking into the Light: Opportunity for Financial Reform in China" (2015). He writes regularly on international finance and monetary economics, financial regulation and global governance for Project Syndicate, Asia News Net and leading economic magazines and newspapers in China and Asia. In April 2013, Mr. Sheng was named by Time magazine as one of the 100 most influential people in the world. He also appeared in the Oscar-winning film "Inside Job" in 2011.

Dr. William K. Fung, SBS, OBE, JP, is the Group Deputy Chairman of the Fung Group of companies, a Hong Kong-based multinational engaged in trading, logistics, distribution and retailing.

He serves as Chairman and Non-Executive Director of Convenience Retail Asia Limited, a publicly listed company within the Fung Group. He was the Group Chairman of Li & Fung Limited (privatized in May 2020) until October 2020. Together with his brother, Victor Fung, Dr. Fung played a leading role in driving the development of the supply chain infrastructure at Li & Fung Limited, which enabled it to become the leading consumer goods design, development, sourcing, and logistics company for major retailers and brands around the world.

Dr. Fung has previously held key positions in major trade and business associations. He is a former Chairman of the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce, the Hong Kong Exporters' Association and the Hong Kong Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation Council (PECC). He was awarded the Silver Bauhinia Star by the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government in 2008.



Dr. Fung is an independent non-executive director of VTech Holdings Limited, Sun Hung Kai Properties Limited and The Hongkong and Shanghai Hotels, Limited.

Dr. Fung graduated from Princeton University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering. He holds a Master of Business Administration degree from the Harvard Graduate School of Business, degrees of Doctor of Business Administration (honoris causa) from The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University and Hong Kong Baptist University and a degree of Doctor of Letters (honoris causa) from Wawasan Open University of Malaysia.

Ms. Saule Agatayeva is a communications and advocacy specialist with over a decade of experience leading high-impact initiatives across Central Asia. Her expertise lies in gender equality, human rights, legal reform, and regional development, where she leverages strategic communication and cross-border collaboration to drive meaningful social change.

In her current role as communications specialist at UN Women, Saule directs external and internal communications for the Central Asian Alliance to End Gender-Based Violence, a regional platform for cooperation aimed at eliminating gender-based violence and harmful practices in Central Asia. She coordinates regional advocacy efforts, mobilizes civil society, and facilitates inclusive policy dialogue addressing gender-based violence.

Her portfolio includes leading region-wide campaign such as 16 Days of Activism—an annual initiative calling for the prevention and elimination of violence against women and children—and promoting the global HeForShe Central Asia movement to amplify narratives of gender equality.

Saule holds a master's degree in political science from Central European University.

As an AsiaGlobal Fellow, her research will explore the role of media, disinformation, equitable masculinity, and inclusion in combating gender-based violence across Central Asia.

# BIOGRAPHY OF ASIAGLOBAL FELLOWS 2025

Ms. Sunika Joshi is a mental health specialist dedicated to advancing gender equality and psychosocial innovation. As the chief executive officer and co-founder of Lighthouse Neural, she adopts an ecological approach to mental health care that addresses the interplay of individual, familial, communal, and systemic factors in wellbeing. With over a decade of experience, Sunika has empowered marginalized communities—particularly women, youth, and LGBTQ+ individuals—through trauma-informed interventions.

She serves as a co-investigator with Mankaa Kura, a mental health counselling provider in Nepal, and Yale University, conducting research on suicide prevention in Nepal and designing culturally adapted psychological interventions for at-risk youth.

Sunika's commitment to community-driven change has been recognized with multiple accolades, including Outstanding President of the Year 2015-16 by Rotaract District 3292 Nepal and Bhutan.



She holds a master's degree in clinical psychology from Royal Holloway, University of London, and a master's degree in social and cultural psychology from ISCTE - University Institute of Lisbon, where her research focused on survivors of gender-based violence and the mental health impacts of discrimination on LGBTQ+ individuals. Sunika is a recipient of Erasmus Mundus and Chevening scholarships.

As an AsiaGlobal Fellow, her research will explore the intersection of mental health, rapid urbanization, and climate change in South Asia, concentrating on inclusive and sustainable solutions to address mental health disparities.

# BIOGRAPHY OF FUNG SCHOLARS

Mr. Jefferson Chen is a social entrepreneur and a philanthropic advisor. He is the co-founder of Lafiya, a global health non-profit backed by the likes of the Gates Foundation that works in Sub-Saharan Africa, providing half a million women with reproductive care. He is also the founder of Serica Advisory, where he helps individuals, families, corporates, and foundations maximise their philanthropic impact. Some of this work includes helping an education foundation active in 60+countries re-design its youth engagement and growth strategy, as well as advising an investment foundation on its US\$15m annual grant-giving and process design.

Raised and educated in China, Canada, and the UK, Jefferson's background is in the natural sciences, having graduated from the University of Oxford as a Fung Scholar. Via a foray of basic science research, medtech, and biotechnology, he came to be a part of the founding investment team of a venture and growth fund in international health innovations with \$200M AUM, structuring 9-figure investment rounds and reviewing Nobel-prize winning innovations.



# BIOGRAPHY OF ASIAGLOBAL FELLOWS 2025

Ms. Khatia Dekanoidze is a former member of the parliament of Georgia and a lecturer with extensive experience in governance and security. Between 2004 and 2012, she held various positions in Georgia's reformist government, significantly transforming the national police force and establishing the modern Police Academy, which she directed from 2008 to 2011. In 2012, she was appointed minister of education and science of Georgia.

In 2014, she was invited by the Ukrainian government to join a team of reformers. As the first female chief of Ukraine's National Police, overseeing more than 110,000 officers, she spearheaded comprehensive reforms, modernizing the police force and leading major anti-corruption initiatives.

She has advised international organizations on law enforcement reforms throughout the former Soviet states and served as an adjunct professor at the George C Marshall European Center for Security Studies, where she contributed to security governance training.

# BIOGRAPHY OF ASIAGLOBAL FELLOWS 2025

With two decades of experience, Ms. Christina Monroe has implemented international exchange and leadership development programs for governments in Asia and the West to promote mutual understanding.

She is currently launching the US's flagship leadership initiative in South Asia after a decade leading the US's flagship Southeast Asian leadership program at the East-West Center, an education and research institution. Her success in virtual community building strengthened the Center's alumni network of 70,000 professionals across 53 chapters in 32 countries. Previously, she directed the University of Colorado Boulder's integration of service and community engagement across faculties.

She holds a master's degree from the University of Amsterdam and a certificate in organizational consulting and change leadership from Georgetown University. She was selected by the Australian Government as an Endeavor Professional Fellow and as a Fulbright Specialist by the US Department of State. Her publications on female entrepreneurship in India, public diplomacy and sustainability education can be found in Sage Publications and Cambridge University Press.

As an AsiaGlobal Fellow, her research will explore Chinese and American leadership theory and practice. Her findings will inform improvements to government- and privately-funded leadership development programs for American and Asian students and professionals.

Dr. Victor K. After gaining his Doctorate in Business Economics from Harvard University, he taught as a professor at Harvard Business School before returning to the family business in Hong Kong in 1976.


### **Accessibility Tour**
